- 2022 Legislative Session HB1450

To transform Maryland's early childhood, primary and secondary education system to the levels of high performing systems around the world

for educators composed of levels through which teachers may progress and gain certain authority, status, and compensation as they gain certain expertise

Blueprint for Maryland's Future Pillars

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More Resources for Students to be Successful

Implement PreK-12 curriculum for students to be college- and career-ready (CCR) by the end of tenth grade

Develop an aligned instructional system with resources and supports necessary to keep students on track to be CCR

Provide students with resources necessary to achieve reading proficiency by end of grade 3

Create a statewide framework for rigorous CTE programs and skills standards

Establish pathways for CCR and non-CCR students in grades 11 and 12

Provide more support for students and schools who need it most, specifically, additional supports for English learners, low-income, and special education students

Provide new Concentration of Poverty grants directly to eligible schools to support community schools and enhance wraparound services

Coordinate community supports to meet student behavioral health needs and provide technical assistance to school systems



Blueprint for Maryland's Future Pillars

Governance and Accountability

Establish the Accountability and Implementation Board to oversee and monitor state and local agencies' progress in implementing Blueprint policies

Develop state and local Blueprint implementation plans

Create expert review teams to visit schools and make recommendations for improving student achievement

Require school systems to demonstrate that at least 75% of per-student formula funding follows students to their schools



Accountability

Ensuring Excellence for All

An accountability-oversight board that has the authority to ensure that the Commission's recommendations are successfully implemented and produce the desired results.

Accountability & Implementation Board (AIB)



- Charged with developing a Comprehensive Implementation Plan for the Blueprint for Maryland's Future.
- The Board is to evaluate the data submitted to it, and assess how well the many components of the Blueprint for Maryland's Future are working to achieve its desired outcome of equal access to a high-quality education.
- By January 1 of each year through 2031, the Board is to review the use of school-level expenditures and monitor school system compliance with the requirements of the Blueprint for Maryland's Future.
- Authorization for the Board ends June 30, 2032 (Chapter 55, Acts of 2021).

Funding Implications

Funding

- Total State and Local funding to increase by \$3.8 Billion over next
 10 years
- State Funding Formulas effective for FY2023
- State Formulas include formulas for:
 - Foundation
 - Comparable Wage Index
 - College and Career Readiness
 - Compensatory Education
 - Pre k
 - Teacher Salary (NBC)

- Concentration of Poverty
- English Learner
- Special Education
- Transitional Supplement Inst.
- Special Education Transportation

Local (County) Funding

- Local Share requirement for most formulas
- FY2024 MOE calculated differently because of FY2023 Hold Harmless adjustments (\$9 Million adjustment)
- By formula, Frederick County's current funding to the BOE is above the required minimum

Funding Follows the Student

The Blueprint requires that at least 75% of most per pupil formula funding (State and local shares) follow students to their schools.



This will require:

- New approaches
- Programmatic budgeting
- More detailed accounting
- Innovative thinking



Funding Summary

- Blueprint legislation & new funding formulas will add additional state aid to FCPS
- FCPS continued growth will also result in increased state and local aid
- Continuation of funding above Maintenance of Effort will be critical to adequately meet the Blueprint requirements
